This course looks at the people of God in biblical history and how they were able to function as a distinct and unique minority in their societies. Particular focus is on the ministries of Daniel and Nehemiah and how they were able to maintain their integrity in their times with a view to what contemporary people of God can learn from them as they apply biblical wisdom in today's hostile situations.

Objectives

At the end of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. Identify how the basic cultural dynamics effected the people of God during the 6th and 5th Centuries B.C.
- 2. Articulate the parallels and contrasts between the people of God then and now.
- Explain the difference between functioning from a dominant position in society vs. from a subdominant position.
- 4. Recognize the people of God as a distinct and unique cultural minority.
- 5. Distinguish between *empowerment* and *enablement* approaches to ministry in a sub-dominant cultural context.
