### COURSE REQUIREMENTS:

**A. Textbook Reading and Review (15%)**- Provide a reading report, due September 11, stating that you have read the required textbooks. Write a review of *Leadership as an Identity* that focuses on the way you will integrate the characteristics of the leadership approach detailed there into your personal approach to leadership responsibilities and practices (i.e., your conceptual framework)

**B. Final Exam (25%)**- A final exam will be given and turned in electronically by September 11. It covers the course textbooks, lectures and discussions.

**C. Case Study (60%)**- Develop a written case study, incorporating the course. This is due by September 11. The case study should identify problems and issues in the specific case and reveal the student's knowledge and understanding of biblical leadership while developing confidence in addressing those problems identified. The case study should integrate the learnings from the course. It should come to specific conclusions, decisions and recommendations to prevent or solve the underlying issues in that case study.

## **Zoom Policy**

Your professor may allow you to Zoom into class or watch Zoom recordings for excused absences based on the professor's discretion and subject to the availability of equipment. Students should contact their professor well in advance of the class meeting. For a third absence the Registrar should be consulted. Your professor may require additional interactive assignments to offset the absence of classroom interaction. Sync or Remote Live courses have priority for the limited Zoom equipment.

## **Extension Policy**

All assignments and exams are to be completed by the deadlines announced in this syllabus or in class.

Extensions for assignments and exams due within the normal duration of the course must be approved beforehand by the Professor. Extensions of two weeks or less beyond the date of the last deadline for the course must be approved beforehand by the Professor. A grade penalty may be assessed.

Extensions of greater than two weeks but not more than six weeks beyond the last deadline for the course may be granted in extenuating circumstances (i.e. illness, family emergency). For an extension of more than two weeks the student must request an Extension Request Form from the Registrar's Office. The request must be approved by the Professor and the Academic Dean. Any incompletes not cleared six weeks after the last published due date for course work will be converted to a failing grade. Professors may have the failing grade changed to a passing grade by request. (RTS Catalog p. 49)
